

Journeys and transport.

Ways to get around.

Art, History, Geography and DT.

We will begin this term learning about Remembrance day, creating some art work to go into the church.

Furthermore, we will be learning about Guy Fawkes and creating some art work using paint.

Our topic this half term is 'Journeys and transport'.

We will start this topic with the question 'How do you get to school?' and create a whole class pictogram. The children will draw their journey to school and consider local landmarks.

Throughout the topic, we will be exploring different types of transport, as well as looking at how transport has changed over time.

The children will design and make a type of transport using their own ideas.

We will also do various Christmas activities towards the end of the term.

R.E

This half term we will be discussing the question: *Why does Christmas matter to Christians?*

Health: P.E/PSHE/mental well-being.

This half term the children will have a weekly Games lesson with Mr Kelly. During the lesson, they will be participating in team games and developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

The children will have a second weekly P.E lesson and this term the focus will be gymnastics and dance. They will develop balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities, as well as perform dances using simple movement patterns.

This year we will be following a PSHE scheme called SCARF. The topic this half term is 'Keeping safe' and 'Growing and changing'.

Science:

The science topic for this half term is: **seasonal changes**. The children will observe changes across the four seasons, as well as observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.



The children will be adding and subtracting (within 10). They will read, write and interpret mathematical statements (+, - and =), represent and use number bonds and solve 1-stop problems.

The children will also develop their ability to recognise, name and sort both 2D and 3D shapes.

The children will continue to learn about place value (within 20). They will count forwards, backwards and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words. They will find 1 more and 1 less and compare and order numbers to 20.

English:

This year the children will do READ,WRITE INC every morning to support them in learning their phonics. They will learn to apply their phonic skills when reading and writing.

The children will have access to a wide range of books.

The children will learn to leave spaces between words, join words and clauses using 'and', begin to punctuate sentences using a capital letter, full stop, question mark or exclamation mark as well as learning year 1 spelling rules.
