Alex has done some beautiful art work this week. Well done Alex!
















Bella has made brilliant picture instructions of how to make Hot cross buns, why they are important to the Easter Story and some great maths. Well done Bella!!


Isla has been practising her spellings and has drawn a lovely picture. Great cheeky sentence Isla



Have a great weekend and I will speak to you next week.


