- Use subordinate clauses to write complex sentences.
- Use passive verbs, the perfect forms of verbs and modal verbs/adverbs appropriately.
- Use expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely (e.g. The fact that it was raining meant the end of sports day)
- Select vocabulary to enhance meaning and describe settings, characters & atmosphere imaginatively
- Use a range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs and advance the action
- Plan, draft and write for a range of purposes and be able to edit and improve effectively.
- Use a sentences structure and layout matched to requirements of text type.
- To use figurative language.
- Use a range of punctuation correctly including bullet points, hyphens, colons and semi-colons
- Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.
- To spell all words from the essential spelling list from the Y6 word list and spell homophones and words with prefixes and suffixes correctly
- · To proof read and correct punctuation and spelling

- Read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000 and describe the value of each digit, including up to three decimal places
- Use negative numbers in context and calculate intervals across zero.
- Identify common factors, common multiples and prime numbers.
- Round any whole number to a set degree of accuracy.
- Identify the value of each digit to 3 decimal places.
- Use knowledge of order of operations to carry out calculations involving four operations.
- Multiply/divide up to a 4-digit by 2-digit using a formal written method
- Solve division calculations including remainders
- Compare, order, add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers.
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in the simplest form.
- Divide proper fractions by whole numbers.
- Associate a fraction with division and identify decimal fraction equivalents
- Recall equivalences between fractions, decimals and percentages
- Identify common factors, multiples and prime numbers
- Calculate the percentage of a whole number.
- Solve problems involving shapes and measure (including perimeter, area, volume, angles and symmetry)
- Use & express missing number problems algebraically
- Solve calculations and practical problems that involve all of the above
- Describe and use coordinates and interpret graphs/data
