The Curriculum End of Year Expectations Year 2



- Continue to apply phonic knowledge to decode words until reading is fluent.
- Read accurately most words of two or more syllables.
- Recognise simple recurring literacy language
- · Read aloud to help with fluency and expression.
- Read words containing suffixes and common exception words.
- Comment on plot, setting & characters in familiar & unfamiliar stories.
- Recognise that no fiction books are structured in different ways.
- · Recount main themes and events.
- · Comment on structure of text.
- Use commas, question marks and exclamation marks to vary expression.
- Identify past/present tense and why the writer has used a tense.
- · Discuss favourite words and phrases.
- · Use content and index to locate information.
- Sound out most unfamiliar words accurately, without undue hesitation.
- Be able to perform some poems by heart.
- Be able to check the text makes sense and clarify meaning of new words if needed.
- Make predictions based on what has been read so far.


This booklet has been produced to give parents/carers clear information about the end of year expectations in reading, writing and maths.

The Curriculum End of Year Expectations Year 2



- Build writing stamina in order to write for different purpose.
- Be able to plan what they are going to write before recording.
- Be able to spell common exception words and those with contracted forms and suffixes.
- Write different kinds of sentence: statement, question, exclamation, command with correct punctuation.
- Use expanded noun phrases to add description and specification.
- Write using subordination (when, if, that, because) and coordination (or, and, but).
- Correct and consistent use of present tense & past tense.
- Correct use of verb tenses.
- Write with correct and consistent use of capital letters and full stops.
- Read aloud own writing with appropriate intonation.
- Use commas in a list.
- Write lower case letters correct size relative to one another.
- Show evidence of diagonal and horizontal strokes to join handwriting.
- Write capital letters of the correct size and orientation.
- Use spacing between words that reflect the size of letters.

- Spot and describe patterns and sequences.
- Understand and use different representations of numbers (e.g. place value counters, number lines)
- Compare and order numbers up to 100 and use <> =.
- Read and write all numbers to 100 in numerals and words.
- Say 10 more/less than any number to 100.
- Count in steps of 2, 3 & 5 from zero and in 10s from any number (forwards and backwards).
- Recall and use multiplication & division facts for 2, 5 & 10 tables.
- Recall and use +/- facts to 20 and use knowledge to solve missing number problems.
- · Derive and use related facts to 100.
- Recognise place value of any 2-digit number (e.g. 25: 2 tens, 5 ones)
- Add & subtract:
 2-digit numbers & ones
 2-digit numbers & tens
 Two 2-digit numbers
 Three 1-digit numbers



- Make effective decisions about how to solve calculations.
- Recognise and use inverse (+/-).
- Recognise, find, name and write fractions (1/3; 1/4; 2/4; ³/₄).
- · Write and recognise equivalence of simple factions.
- Tell time to 15 minutes, including quarter past/to.
- Describe properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
- Explore, compare and order measurements (including cm/m, g/kg, ml/l).
- Recognise p and £ and solve problems by combining amounts and calculating change.
