Health: P.E/PSHE/mental well-being.

This half term the children will have a weekly Games lesson with Mr Kelly. During the lesson, they will be participating in team games and developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

The children will have a second weekly P.E lesson and this half term we will continue to master basic moves including running, jumping, throwing and catching.

As part of our topic, the children will practice marching to 'The grand old duke of York', as well as learning about jousting.

This year we are following a PSHE scheme called SCARF. The topic this half term is 'healthy relationships', where the children will be learning about surprises and secrets, and how to be a good listener.

Castles

Topic

We will begin this half term with a focus on wellbeing. The children will learn about the 5 steps to wellbeing, as well as taking part in dancing, singing, a welly walk to the woods and a mindfulness session.

Our topic this half term is 'castles'.
The children will learn about our local castles, as well as building and describing their own castle.

The children will paint a castle in the style of the artist <u>Paul Klee</u>.



Maths

The children will be adding and subtracting (within 20). They will read, write and interpret mathematical statements (+, - and =), represent and use number bonds and solve 1-step problems.

The children will learn about place value (within 50). They will count forwards and backwards to 50, use practical equipment to represent numbers to 50, find 1 more/1 less, compare and order numbers within 50, as well as learning to count in 2's and 5's.

English:

This year the children will do READ, WRITE INC every morning to support them in learning their phonics. They will learn to apply their phonic skills when reading and writing.

The children will have access to a wide range of books.

The children will learn to leave spaces between words, join words and clauses using 'and', begin to punctuate sentences using a capital letter, full stop, question mark or exclamation mark as well as learning year 1 spelling rules.

R.E

This half term we will be discussing the question: Why does Easter matter to Christians?

Science:

The science topic this half term is <u>everyday materials</u>. The children will identify and name a variety of everyday materials & describe their simple physical properties.

The children will continue to observe changes across the four seasons, as well as observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
