- · Give a personal point of view on a text.
- Re-explain a text with confidence.
- Justify inferences with evidence, predicting what might happen from details stated or implied.
- Use appropriate voices for characters within a story.
- Recognise apostrophe of possession (plural)
- Identify how sentence type can be changed by altering word order, tenses, adding/deleting words or amending punctuation.
- Explain why a writer has used different sentence types or a particular word order and the effect I has created.
- Skim or scan to locate information and/or answer a question.
- Learn and acquire new vocabulary from a wider range of books suitable for my age.
- Check text makes sense by discussing my understanding and asking questions.
- · Retrieve and record information from non-fiction.

## The Curriculum End of Year Expectations Year 4



- Plan, draft, write, evaluate and edit different forms of writing.
- Vary sentence structure, using different openers.
- Use adjectival phrases (e.g. biting cold wind).
- Use appropriate choice of noun or pronoun.
- Use a comma after a fronted adverbial. (e.g. later that day I heard bad news)
- Use apostrophe for plural possession.
- Use commas to mark clauses.
- Use first three letters to check spellings in a dictionary.
- Use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause.
- Use paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme.
- Use connecting adverbs to link paragraphs.
- Write with increasing legibility, consistency and quality.
- To spell all the words on the essential spelling list from years 3 and 4.
- Use and punctuate direct speech.
- Proof read to improve spelling and punctuation.
- Spell words that are often misspelt.

- Identify angles or acute and obtuse
- Use coordinates to describe positions.
- Count backwards through zero to include negative numbers.
- Compare and order numbers beyond 1,000.
- Compare and order numbers with up to 2 decimal places.
- Read Roman numerals up to 100
- Find 1,000 more/less than a given number.
- Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts all tables to 12x12.
- Recognise place value from each digit in any 4-digit number.
- Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1,000.
- Round decimals with 1 decimal point to nearest whole number.
- Add and subtract: Numbers with up to 4-digits using written columnar method.
- Multiply 2-digit and 3 digit numbers by 1 digit using formal method.
- Count up/down in hundredths.
- Recognise and write equivalent fractions and equivalent decimals.
- · Add and subtract fractions with same denominator.
- Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12 and 24 hour clocks.
- Solve simply measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals.
